Pascall Prize

A new literary prize of special interest to public libraries will be awarded for the first time on 23 May. The Pascall Prize — created to commemorate the flamboyant journalist, Geraldine Pascall who died in 1983 — is not given for an individual work, but seeks to recognise the overall literary contribution of a writer, journalist, poet, or playwright. Shortlisted for this year's prize are Helen Garner, David Malouf, Frank Moorhouse, Louis Nowra and Eric Rolls.

The sponsor of the \$25,000 prize, the Geraldine Pascall Foundation, is willing to supply posters and book stickers to public libraries wishing to mount a display of the winning author's publication/s. Dublin bound

Veronica Paterson from the State Library of South Australia has been accepted for a three-month internship on book and paper conservation at Trinity College, Dublin University.

Veronica's career at the library started in May 1982 as a trainee booksewer. The following year she signed her apprenticeship papers and was the first woman to become a bookbinding apprentice in the library's history. Veronica has gained approval to study at this internationally renowned workshop with the full support of her colleagues, the management of the State Library and the Department of Local Government.

LAA lobbying

The LAA's Queensland Branch made good use of the Association's MediaNet facility recently. A media release congratulating the Queensland State Government on the opening of the new State Library, drafted by Qld Branch President, Phil Roberts, also set out some home truths about libraries in the Sunshine State. The piece was run on page five of the *Courier Mail* of 9 April.

Phil Roberts pointed out that 'Queensland has the worst funding for public libraries in Australia with \$2.34 per capita compared with over \$10 per capita in other states.' He also commented on the funding cuts to libraries in the last State budget; the cut to staffing levels in school libraries; and drew attention to the fact that the normal CPI increase in cash subsidies to Queensland public libraries was not granted.
