

# A unique children's library

The Children's Library within the State Library of Queensland is unique in that it is a public demonstration collection consisting of fiction and non-fiction material and interactive educational software, audio-visual and reference material.

The Library is well suited to filling an educational and promotional role. It provides a consultancy facility for the public, but most of the librarians' time is spent devising and implementing literature-based programs for the many preschool, primary and special school groups that attend during the school semester. Actually, the Library is an amalgamation of public, reference and school-library functions, and has proved extremely popular since opening in April last year.

The Children's Library is open 6 days a week from 10 am to 5 pm, with Sundays drawing healthy numbers. Storytelling for the very young is held regularly on Sundays and Friday mornings.
