# Toeplitz Library officially named

THE library at AFTRS was officially named the Toeplitz Library, after the inaugural Director of the School, Professor Jerzy Toeplitz, on 20 October 1988.

During the ceremony, Professor Toeplitz described himself as a film and book man, not necessarily in that order.

'Both media are equally important. Reading gives you ideas, and without this inspiration, you can't make films,' he said.

The AFTRS library began in 1973 with the aim of becoming the definitive collection of books, periodicals and publications on film and television in Australia.

In 1974 a fulltime librarian, Peter Wagner, was appointed and by 1975 the library had become 'the most complete library on film and television in Australia, with 4000 books, and subscriptions to 200 periodicals'.

The development of the library as a major resource in film and television, with a strong emphasis on academic research and the philosophical and historical aspects of film, was in great part due to the influence and interest of Professor Toeplitz.

Professor Toeplitz laid the foundations for the development of the collection as it is today, as a major research and reference resource in film, television, radio and the media. The library now has 15,500 books, subscribes to over 230
