VALA Travel Scholarship

CALL FOR APPLICATIONS

The VALA Travel Scholarship is awarded to persons intending to undertake overseas travel to examine aspects of library automation. Candidates examining implementation of newer technologies not yet seen in Australia and of general interest to the library and information community are more likely to be successful.

The Scholarship is awarded to assist in meeting expenses for travel overseas. No formal qualifications are required and although candidates should be working in the library and information community, applications from candidates not working in traditional library environments or with traditional qualifications will be accepted.

The successful candidate will receive \$10,000 towards travel, accommodation or living expenses. The successful candidate will normally take up the award within 9 months and present a paper at the 6th Biennial VALA Conference in November 1991.
