# In praise of Katz

Bill Katz is one of those rare figures in the literature of librarianship: the author of recognised standard works, an editor whom one actually remembers, and an editor with stamina to boot.

Back in 1971 Katz edited Library Lit. reproducing the best articles in the field that had been published in the previous year, drawn from an amazingly wideranging variety of sources. And from then on, a jury would select the 'best' thirty or so items for the year from 200 or more pieces that (mainly) Bill brought to them for judgment. The approach was far from parochial: Katz and his fellows looked well beyond library periodicals for 'writing of relevance and interest to librarians and students of librarianship'. Articles came from periodicals as diverse as Science, Dissent and New Yorker.

With Library lit 18: the best of 1987, Katz's editorship draws to a close, and a fine swan song it is, with some marvellous stuff: CD-ROMs, the history of young adult services, the ethics of book reviewing, the records of the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI), networks, management - matters of contemporary concern or simply darned interesting. Like Margaret Cribbs' article on the 'invisible drip' of computer data that is actively or passively destroyed.

This is vintage Editor Katz, an excellent antidote to Rip van Winkleism, a good read, and good value at US\$28.50. *Library Lit 18* was published in 1988 by Scarecrow, and the review copy was supplied by James Bennett Library Services. (ISBN 0 8108 2163 X)
