### FIT to expand

The Chief Librarian at the Footscray Institute of Technology (FIT), Doreen Parker, reports that construction of FIT's new Library and Students' Union building, begun in August 1990, is progressing according to schedule.

The new building will enable the library to increase its book and periodical collections and its information and audio-visual services to support the Institute's teaching and research role within the proposed new University of Technology — an amalgamation between FIT, the Royal Melbourne Institute of Technology (RMIT) and the Western Institute. Completion is scheduled for October, 1990.

# Sign of the times

Seventeen staff from Southern Regional Libraries and sections of State Library Headquarters in Tasmania have just completed a basic course in sign language for the hearing impaired.

The course—which comprised eight 1.5-hour sessions — was provided by the Tasmanian Deaf Society. One of the tutors, Diana Hodgetts, who herself has a hearing impairment, is presently 'on loan' to the Hobart Lending Library for about 3 months.

Diana's transfer to Lending is intended to help staff become aware of the needs of library users with hearing disabilities and to help promote the service to the deaf community.
