# AUSTRALIAN SECURITY INTELLIGENCE ORGANIZATION

DESCRIPTION: The Australian Security Intelligence Organization seeks a motivated and responsible person to fill the position of Library Officer/Librarian. The successful applicant will join the library team within the Corporate Services Branch at the Canberra Central Office.

**DUTIES:** While the successful applicant will be expected to work in all facets of the library's operation, duties will concentrate on reference services to users.
