NT book vote cut by 35%

The Northern Territory Public Library Service is dismayed at the reduction in the book vote from \$1,000,000 in 1986–87 to \$648,000 in 1988–89. Macmillan acquires BRS

Macmillan Inc. has announced the acquisition of BRS Information Technologies from the Thyssen-Bornemisza Group (TBG). BRS will be combined with Pergamon ORBIT Infoline. Databases available through the enlarged group will include Medline, Embase, BIOSIS, the Comprehensive Core Medical Library and Psychological Abstracts.

TAFE card catalogue pensioned off

Dr Allan Pattison, Director-General of the Department of Technical and Further Education carried out a ceremony at Sydney Technical College of drawing the curtain on framed catalogue cards and untying a ribbon on the OPAC to symbolise the end of card catalogue era.



The card catalogue has now been withdrawn from TAFE libraries and access to the collection is by microfiche or OPAC catalogues. Planning is proceeding towards a CD-ROM catalogue in the near future.

META-marc wins SA TAFE contract

META-BCI Limited recently signalled its intent to drive META-marc, its library automation package, into the wider

education library market by winning the South Australian TAFE contract. This contract will see META-marc installed in twelve colleges over the next two years.

META-marc, designed in Australia and on the market for some years, was originally targeted at the school library market.

New library complex for Toowoomba

The City of Toowoomba, the regional centre of Queensland's agriculturally rich Darling Downs, recently opened its new \$2.7 million library complex. The library commenced operations in the new complex using the latest in computerised library management systems.

BOOK Plus, developed by Stowe Computing Australia, is a fully integrated, flexible system that will enable the Toowoomba Library to provide a high quality, efficient service to its 24,000 members.

The City Librarian, Mr Peter Miller, said that the system will greatly benefit staff and members.

'Manual jobs such as filing of catalogue cards will be eliminated with the use of a computerised facility, which will leave the staff free to do more productive tasks', Mr Miller said.

He added that 6 OPAC (On-line Public Access Catalogue) terminals had been installed to assist library users.

Report from the **ALIA Audiovisual Services Committee**

The trial edition of the new National Union Catalogue, NUC:N is now available. This National Union catalogue of non-book materials includes cartographic materials, motion picture and video recordings, audio recordings, music scores, slides, pictorial materials, transparencies, kits, manuscripts and computer software. The convenor of the Audiovisual Services Committee of the Library Association of Australia, Paul McNally, commended the National Library of Australia on publication of the trial edition of the new union catalogue. 'NUC:N will be a vital part of the bibliographic apparatus of materials in Australia. non-book Librarians will find it an invaluable tool for selection and for locating items for inter-library lending purposes.

Since the demise of NUCAV (National Union Catalogue of Audiovisual

Materials), the Audiovisual Services Committee of the Library Association of Australia has sought to have a national union catalogue of non-book materials produced. Although the 150,000 items recorded in NUC:N are available on ABN and in the ABN Catalogue (Published in microfiche) they were 'lost' in the 2,500,000 records for books. Librarians specialising in any of the forms of non-book materials represented in the new union catalogue will now be able to refer to the 28 fiche set of NUC:N which will make their task of obtaining information on non-book materials so much easier. The current edition is available from the sales subscriptions section of the National Library of Australia at a cost of \$25.
