The NLNZ Annual Report for the year ended 30 June 1990 has just reached us. In spite of a 15 per cent reduction in staff to match decreased funding since 1988, the library has maintained its services and met performance standards in all areas where this has been the objective. The use of the library's information services has gone up by 56 per cent and of the Alexander Turnbull Library by 42 per cent over 1988/89.


