# Guiding your writing style

Renton, Nick. *Renton's Elements of Style & Good Writing.* Melbourne: Schwartz and Wilkinson, 1990. 212 pp. \$19.95 ISBN 186337 023 4.

Why another style guide? Nick Renton believes that his new book 'differs from the others on the subject in presentation, in emphasis and occasionally in substance ... it endeavours to concentrate on those aspects of greatest relevance to ordinary writers and in particular on those aspects which are frequently not covered in other works of reference.' He hopes also that 'this book can be adopted, with or without modification, as a house style manual for organisations without a specific manual of their own.'

How far he succeeds probably depends on what his reader knew before. For many of us Fowler's *Modern English Usage*, Strunk and White's *The Elements of Style* (3rd edition, Macmillan, 1979 — enormous value in just 92 pages) and the *AGPS Style Manual* (4th edition, AGPS, 1988) between them cover much the same territory. Renton advocates the *Concise Oxford Dictionary* and the *Macquarie Concise Dictionary*, but for Australian use (and to complement the *AGPS Style Manual*) the big *Macquarie Dictionary* is not much more expensive and is almost essential for any serious writing.

Renton claims to be up-to-the-minute with his 5-page chapter on 'Gender Neutral Language' (but the AGPS gives us 17 pages on this topic). Renton is strong on grammatical points and he shines in the profusion of examples he gives of punctuation, 'troublesome words', Americanisms and the like. You might quibble that he overdoes the grammar bit, especially with a whole Appendix devoted to the subjunctive mood, in which one example is 'See that all be in readiness' — surely a far cry from anyone's usual style!

Is much of your working life spent in writing? Then you should continually be honing your main tool, the English language, and critically assessing your use of it. Renton makes interesting reading to help you do this, but will not displace the books listed above.  $\square$
