New ILL code from ACLIS

THE AUSTRALIAN COUNCIL of Libraries and Information Services, ACLIS, has recently released a new *Australian Interlending Code*, 'to facilitate the sharing of resources of the Distributed National Collection by improving efficiency within an equitable framework'. The *Code* consists of definitions, policy guidelines and procedural advice covering such matters as making requests, payment, dispatch of material, care of material, renewals and returns. It

is not intended to exclude special lending arrangements between libraries, and indeed the *Code* suggests that some libraries may wish to develop more detailed procedures to supplement the provisions in the code.

ACLIS intends to review the *Code* in about twelve months' time, and in the meantime is inviting comments on it. The *Code* is available free of charge from the ACLIS Secretariat, PO Box E202, Queen Victoria Terrace, ACT 2600. ■

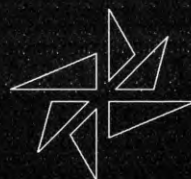

THE METCALFE MEDALLION



John Metcalfe was responsible for establishing the basis of the profession of librarianship in Australia and was the dominating influence in the profession in this country until his retirement in the 1960's. John Metcalfe and his contribution to librarianship and library education are commemorated by the Australian Library and Information Association through the Metcalfe Medallion.

The award is for the most outstanding essay or other piece of work on a topic of interest to library and information services and consists of a medallion and a year's membership of the Association. Students are invited to submit entries for this award.

- To meet the criteria for the award entries for the ALIA Metcalfe Medallion should:
 - be submitted in triplicate by a student undertaking a first award course in library and information science;
 - be an essay or other piece of work of up to 5000 words in length of interest to library and information science;
 - be written in a form or style appropriate for publishing in an ALIA journal or as an ALIA Press publication;
 - indicate competence in the analysis, evaluation or synthesis of data, information or previously published material;
 - include a declaration stating that the entry is the student's own work.
