

## Not much interest in research

But **Gabrielle Butler** says La Trobe University Library now has a policy statement

**D**URING THE first half of 1991 a survey of library staff attitudes and interest in research was undertaken by La Trobe University Library Research Committee. There were 18 responses received out of a total of 135 staff surveyed. The poor response makes it difficult to generalise about the findings, however it did indicate to the Committee that a statement on the Library's policy regarding research was necessary.

A working party was formed, and drafted a policy based on the QUT Library's Policy on Library

Research and Development. This document was reported at on the UCRLS Workshop on Research held in November 1991.

Included in the La Trobe policy are sections on the Library's research goals, how the Library supports research, types of research supported, funding, quality and ethical standards, and appendices detailing both the procedures followed by the Committee and those to be followed by the applicant. **T**HE AUSTRALIAN International Development Assistance Bureau (AIDAB) is inviting proposals for funding through the Women in Development Fund—Small Grants Scheme (WIDF—SGS) in 1992/93. \$1.5 million are available, of which \$170 000 has already been committed.

Detailed guidelines on eligibility for WIDF—SGS funding may be obtained from the address below. Essentially, the projects

supported by the Fund should have potential for wider application, and/or support efforts to increase women's participation in the development process. Preference is given to projects undertaken by indigenous female researchers.
