

## Bibliographical and indexing projects

Liz Lee reports on two recent meetings

national meeting on Collaborative Indexing Projects, convened by Professor John Barnes, La Trobe University, was held at the Barr Smith Library, University of Adelaide, on 30 September 1993. The meeting was attached to the Bibliographical Society of Australia and New Zealand Annual Conference 'Order out of Chaos' which focussed on both current and proposed indexing projects. 80 people attended, including 60 academics, and representatives from the National Library, the State Library of South Australia, the Public Library of New South Wales, and the Barr Smith Library.

The meeting agreed that a national committee be set up with Professor Barnes as Convener to do two things: put together collaborative indexing projects and apply for funding; and look in detail at the practical problems associated with indexing.
