ANU and the National Library of China have joined forces to link them to the Internet

The National Library of China and the Australian National University (ANU) have just signed a letter of intent in Beijing to make Chinese literature available globally via the Internet.

The National Library of China will index Chinese journals, notably in economic, business, political and social sciences, to provide an up-to-date analysis of Chinese information. The ANU, through its Centre for Networked Access to Scholarly Information, will distribute this information around the world via the Internet directly to the terminals of interested scholars and libraries. supply and information business analyses will also be offered.

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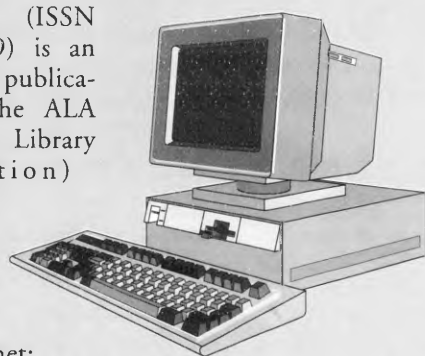
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
