one day seminar in May on Outsourcing libraries looked at the issues and processes involved in tendering out technical services — a topic relevant to all libraries in the 1990s, and of particular relevance to Victoria's public libraries. Speakers from academic, special and public libraries addressed the topic from their sector's point of view and a panel representing library suppliers and other agencies discussed the ideal tender document and other aspects of the tendering process from the tenderer's point of view.

How much did you say? A descriptive survey of library buying in Australia was published in September. This publication, sponsored by the Acquisitions Section (Victorian Group) and ACLIS is published by the Centre for Information Studies and is No 4 in their CIS research reports series. The survey conducted by CIS was based on questionnaires sent to Australian academic, special and public libraries' sources of supply and reveals some surprising statistics about Australian suppliers' sources of supply. Speakers from Australian and overseas academic and special libraries looked at the issues and techniques involved in providing client centred technical services. The seminar presented a range of practical solutions and posed some challenging ques-
