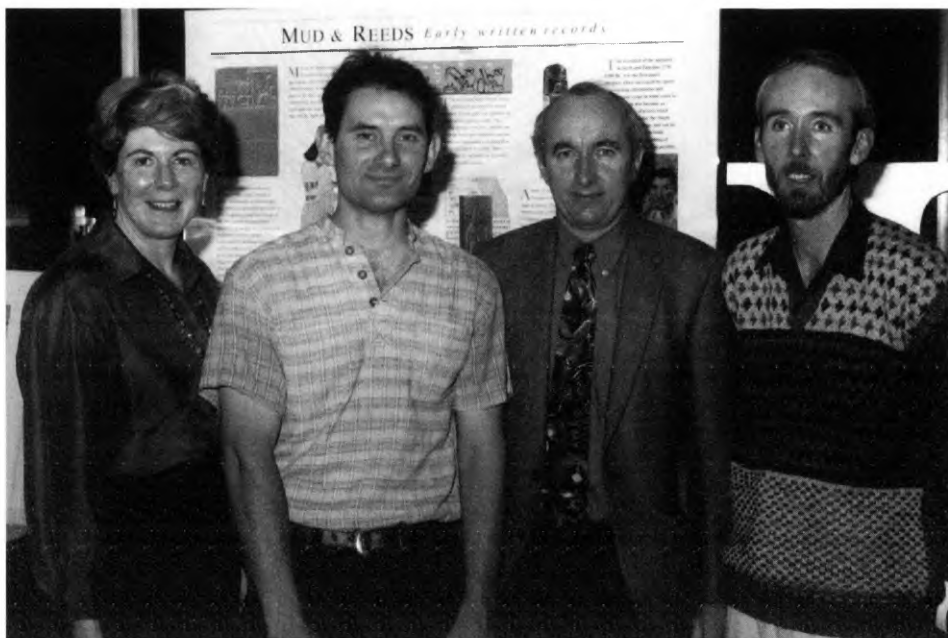

Have exhibition, will travel

Jenny Tonkin, State Library of South Australia

An innovative poster exhibition developed by the State Library of South Australia has been favourably received by audiences interstate. First appearing in Brisbane last November at the national preservation conference, it is currently on display at Macquarie University Library in Sydney.

Called *From tablet to terminal* the exhibition covers the entire history of information storage and retrieval from clay tablets to the Internet, and was developed jointly by staff from the public programs and rare books sections of the State Library of South Australia to mark Australian Library Week 1995. It was also used as a springboard for the launch of Internet access through the State Library and the release of a comprehensive brochure on the library, appropriately titled, *A galaxy of information*.

The exhibition comprises a series of

seven posters created by Peter Murdoch and Jenny Tonkin to illustrate and explain the landmark developments which led from clay tablets stored in baskets, retrieved and read by a select few, to a global network of information in digital form shared by almost everyone. Each poster uses a blend of graphic imagery and text to convey its message.

The State Library of South Australia would like to see the exhibition used as much as possible and encourages other libraries and organisations to consider it as an adjunct to its activities.
