

Equal opportunity strategy



LIA, in conjunction with the Department of Education, Employment, Training and Youth Affairs (DEETYA), has developed a sector-wide recruitment and career development strategy in response to the Commonwealth Government's Aboriginal employment development policy (AEDP) launched in 1987.

As Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people are the most disadvantaged group in Australia in terms of health, housing, education, employment and development, the AEDP was designed to assist in overcoming these disadvantages by providing them with greater access to education and employment.

The strategy will provide permanent employment for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples within the library and information sector, and encourage the library and information sector to become more accessible to Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples. Participation in the strategy will provide benefits for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander

people and for the library and information sector.

The co-ordinators of the strategy will be encouraging libraries to access DEETYA resources which include cadetships, traineeships, Training for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islanders programs and work experience programs to enable Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people to be employed and to gain experience.

The strategy commenced in January 1996 with myself as the national co-ordinator and Lyn Ella as the assistant coordinator - both of us work from ALIA National Office. In the first year we will focus our efforts on implementing the strategy with the library and information services in the Australian Capital Territory, New South Wales, Northern Territory and Queensland. However, if libraries in other states are keen to participate sooner in the program, they will be encouraged to do so.

As part of the strategy a questionnaire will be sent to libraries in the strategy's target areas, to survey the num-

bers of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples currently employed in libraries and the employment strategies already in place. This questionnaire will provide ALIA with information vital to the planning and implementation of the strategy.

There is already good support for the strategy. I have received a number of enquiries from libraries seeking information about having cadets or trainees, as well as people interested in being a cadet or trainee.

The first steering committee meeting for the strategy was held in Canberra at ALIA House on 28 March 1996. The steering committee members are Isabel Tarago (chair), Queensland community representative; Melissa Jackson co-ordinator ATSILIRN; Matilda House, ACT community representative; Bill Humes, ATSIC representative; Alex Byrne, ALIA representative; Roy Sanders, ALIA executive member; Kay Robinson, DEETYA; Jennefer Nicholson, ALIA; and Alana Garwood, national coordinator.
