Creating libraries with a new attitude

Cross-cultural awareness training for library staff

istorically there has always been a lack of Aboriginal involvement in the library system. Increased usage by Aboriginal clients and the proliferation of Aboriginal information related sources has seen a dire need for librarians to understand Aboriginal culture and client needs. Increasingly there were calls from collegues with requests such as: 'How do I get Kooris into the library?' 'What sort of rnaterials should aboutlesting?' 'How do I develop an appropriate local history collection that includes Aboriginal perspectives?' 'My staff are not used to dealing with Aboriginal people — What can I do?'.

These are quite valid concerns and are indicative of a genuine need from within the library community to understand indigenous cultures. During 1994 (the year of the World's Indigenous Peoples) the Public Libraries Branch of the State Library of New South Wales

recruited our help in educating NSW library staff and equipping them with skills for cross-cultural communication. We incorporated the work of Dalton Morgan and Associates from South Australia (who had already worked extensively in the area) to facilitate our training. This resulted in the development of a one and a half day Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander awareness program.

The cross-cultural awareness training and information program aims to develop awareness within the framework of anti-racist thinking. The program is intended as a basic or introductory course which introduces and explores three major areas:

- Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander history, cultures and people;
- non-indigenous attitudes towards Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples and how they are formed; and

 cross-cultural behaviour and actions (and how they affect library operations).

The program differs from other programs in as much as it explores attitudes and how they are formed. It is essentially aimed at sensitising participants to the complex nature of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander cultures and how they are viewed by non-indigenous people — in turn developing a greater awareness and understanding of those cultures and how they operate.

The program is neither an exercise in political-correctness nor confrontational, but a realistic and honest look at Aboriginal people and cultures. People get out of it what they put in and to date we have had an extremely encouraging percentage of participants who have had their perceptions of indigenous cultures and the nature of racism altered.

In the end we all hope for libraries with *new* attitudes.
