

Qld launches ALW with a splash in Townsville

Townsville's Great Barrier Reef Aquarium: an unusual venue for Queensland's launch of Australian Library Week

ver eighty ALIA members and their guests joined with the State Librarian of Queensland, Des Stephens, and the chair of the Great Barrier Reef Marine Park Authority (GBRMPA), Dr Ian McPhail, to celebrate the launch of Australian Library Week on Tuesday 7 May.

Dr McPhail delivered a highly entertaining and inspiring keynote address, which included his experiences with the State Library of South Australia. He spoke of librarians as

motivated and intelligent professional people, far removed from lingering stereotypes. Dr McPhail also highlighted the services provided by special libraries, and praised the work of special librarians in both public and private organisations.

Local ALIA members were also delighted to have Dr McPhail present GBRMPA's library manager, Suzie Davies, with an *Excellence in achievement* commendation from the Queensland Special Libraries group.

Des Stephens launched the festivities by opening a large viewing window into the main aquarium. The proceedings caught an aquarium diver off guard as he immersed himself in the literature of corals, in the main tank! The sheer novelty of the launch attracted considerable media attention, including television coverage on the TEN Network and WIN Townsville.

The work of the State Library of Queensland in regional areas featured in Des Stephens' address. He described the Internet as a major challenge facing public libraries throughout the State. Both themes were carried over into media interviews following the launch.

This year's launch was the first to be held outside Brisbane. The Queensland Library Promotion Council (QLPC) sought expressions of interest from regional areas in late 1995. A joint submission from ALIA's North Queensland Division proposed the launch in

Townsville and closing festivities in Cairns. The collaborative nature of this year's celebrations were reflected in the Queensland theme, *Reading the future: From reef to rainforest.*

Much of the funding for the week's activities came from the QLPC, including sponsorship of a television advertisement which was aired on the TEN Network in the fortnight leading up to the launch.

The tremendous success of the launch did not overshadow an impressive range of other activities across North Queensland. The ALIA North Queensland division sponsored another high-profile window display in Townsville's Flinders Mall. Aitkenvale Library hosted the official launch of Townsville's InfoPlus community information network on Thursday 9 May, and also conducted behind the scenes library tours. Thuringowa City Library and Hinchinbrook Shire Libraries held a variety of activities for children, including story-telling and craft afternoons. The regional flavour of Australian Library Week activities was epitomised by Bowen Shire Library's display entitled From horse and cart to cyberspace.

The success of this year's Queensland launch certainly spread from reef to rainforest, and beyond.
