he Western Australian continuing professional development committee and the Internet fair committee provided an excellent start to Australian Library Week 1996 with an Internet fair at Curtin University's Information Studies Department lecture theatre.

The Western Australian branch president, Vicky Wilson, gave the welcoming address and impressed upon all that library professionals have an important role as educators, navigators and information providers of Internet information. Gregg Boalch from the Curtin Business School was the keynote speaker. Greg talked about the growth of the Internet and reminded us that the Internet is nothing more than a new piece of technology. He sees the role of librarians as gatekeepers of the Internet.

Other speakers included Margaret Jones who spoke about Internet training and the need for library professionals to keep up-todate with the changes to the Internet; Kathryn Osborne who spoke about World Wide Web page design — concentrating on content, maintenance, organisation, tricks and publishing; Bobby Bruce spoke about the Internet and society and how our profession needs to emcompass this technology she stressed that we need to be leaders not followers; and Trevis Lawton explored the issue of public access to the Internet and the importance of training library staff to train clients.

The continuing professional development committee hopes that those who attended found the day informative and inter-
