he national launch of Australian Library Week was the inaugural Australian Library Week oration, delivered by Sir Anthony Mason, former chief justice of the High Court, and currently chair of the National Library of Australia Council. The Dixson Room at the State Library of New South Wales provided an elegant backdrop for what was a fairly controversial assault on the copyright law review process and its possible outcomes. The Oration was recorded by ABC Radio National for later broadcast and received great print media coverage including articles in The Australian, The Sydney Morning Herald and most other state dailies. It was especially pleasing to see so many old friends and students attend.

A company directors' briefing, a joint activity with the NSW division of the Australian Institute of Company Directors, by Laurence Prusak and James Matarazzo, wellknown researchers, writers and

speakers in information and business from the United States of America was held at the Regent of Sydney.

The briefing attracted an audience of over eighty people, most of whom were directors from small- to medium-sized companies. The success of the event was such that we are now being encouraged to plan future joint activities with the Institute.

A seminar, presented by Prusak and Matarazzo on the subject of Knowledge management and new ways of managing information was presented to an audience of 180 in the Eugene Gossens Hall at the ABC Ultimo Centre. Participants represented the information industry in its broadest sense, with librar-
