Standards key to interconnectivity

s networking, the Internet and 'intranets' continue to dominate the consciousness both of the automation community as a whole and the worldwide library community in particular, DRA is especially excited that a cause we have long championed — standards-based library resource sharing using networking technologies — is moving front and center on the international stage.

The International Organisation for Standardisation (ISO) has recently fast-tracked balloting on adopting the Z39.50 as the ISO standard for search and retrieval among disparate systems. DRA is well-known for our long-time advocacy and implementation of Z39.50, having co-founded the two major testing and implementation groups for the original standard and now having more Z39.50 servers in every-

day production use around the world than any other automation vendor. The next step, we believe, is using Z39.50 in concert with other standards (patron profile, interlibrary loan, holdings) to achieve something we call Worldwide Information Search, Retrieval and Delivery (WISRD). The idea behind WISRD is that the end-user should be able to have desired document or material delivered to him or her as efficiently and easily as possible.

We are very honoured to have been chosen for a country-wide implementation of this concept in the LIBSERV project in Singapore, and are also happy to announce the availability of our system on UNIX, which should facilitate our efforts to implement similar regional, national and international resource-sharing projects in Australia, New Zealand and elsewhere in the Australasian region.
