he ALIA (Queensland branch) mentoring project was launched in Brisbane on Tuesday 23 July 1996. Prospective mentors and mentees met with members from the co-ordinating committee and branch council, along with Deborah Johnstone, the consultant to the group. The evening combined social elements with facilitated training, and included the opportunity for partnerships to be negotiated and formalised.

The aim of the project is to provide a facilitated mentoring program to meet the development needs of library professionals at various levels. The co-ordinating committee has provided general guidelines as an introduction to the formal program and will monitor the progress of the scheme for the trial period of twelve months.

An interesting aspect of the project is the establishment of arrangements with non-metropolitan candidates, taking into account
