

## Beyond words

**Exhibition of beautiful books** 

he work of internationally acclaimed British bookbinder, Edgar Mansfield, will be showcased in an exhibition at the State Library of Queensland until the end of September.

The Beyond words exhibition features twenty-seven bookbindings designed by artist Edgar

Mansfield and realised by James Brockman. Edgar Mansfield is recognised as one of the most innovative and influential 20th century bookbinders. Instead of adopting the traditional decorative motifs of the craft, Mansfield looked to contemporary fine art for inspiration. His bold expressive designs, derived from the language of abstract art, helped revitalise the craft of bookbinding during the 1940s and 1950s.

Mansfield also brought a new attitude to the use of leather in bookbinding. Rather than using only perfect, blemish-free leather, he emphasised the natural grain of the surface and often incorporated blemishes as a feature of his designs.

At 89 Edgar mansfield has retired to Kent but will be remembered for demonstrating that bookbinding is as appropriate a medium for the artist as painting and sculpture. The bindings in this exhibition have been lent from the private collection of Colin Hamilton and Kulgin Duval of Perthshire, Scotland.

Beyond words can be viewed at the State Library of Queensland, Brisbane until 29 September.
