State Budget night 1996 saw the announcement of \$15 million for information technology for South Australian schools, pre-schools and other Department for Education and Children's Services sites in 1996/97. The \$15 million is to fund the first phase of a five-year project known as DECStech 2001 which is responsible for the implementation of the DECS Information Technology Plan. \$4 million of the \$15 million is to be used for the provision of computers in schools. The remainder will be spent on the initial stages of network provision to support the longer term goals of the Plan

The DECStech 2001 Project was established in February 1996 to ensure that, by the year 2001, South Australians will have a technologically-rich education and child care service. The Project includes integrated components such as:

 a developed infrastructure and network capability that will enable connections to be made between all schools and DECS sites (as well as to the world beyond the school) for curriculum and administrative purposes;

- a training and professional development strategy to support all staff in the use of technology; and
- the embedding of information technology in all areas of the curriculum.

Teacher-librarians have long been at the forefront of technological change. In a number of schools teacher-librarians are already taking leadership roles in the current wave of advances in information and communications technologies, offering training sessions on Nexus and the Internet.

DECStech 2001 will give all teacher-librarians the opportunity to hone their information technology skills as students and teachers' expectations expand. Ensuring that all members of the school community have the information literacy skills necessary to maximise access to this vast sea of information will keep teacher-librarians very busy for the next five years.
