1996 Maria Gemenis Award winner

ongratulations to the 1996 Maria Gemenis Award winner, Frances Bluhdorn who received her award at a ceremony held on 17 July at the Carrington Restaurant at the All Seasons Premier Menzies Hotel in Sydney. The Maria Gemenis Award is presented to a Special librarian in New South Wales who has made a significant contribution to Special librarianship through their willingness to share their professional expertise, break down the barriers of librarians in isolation, and successfully promote the library/information service and achieve outstanding recognition from their parent organisation.

Frances has been a member of ALIA since 1975 and has held sixteen positions in various ALIA sections and committees, including president of New South Wales branch council.

Work and ALIA activities (and a life outside of them!) would be enough for most people Frances has rocketed beyond them in a demonstration of great energy and willingness to share her skills and knowledge with the publication of more than eleven articles and the presentation of sixteen papers, the subjects ranging from various aspects of medical librarianship, the impact of new technology on libraries to a creative description of a new ALIA special interest group.

Frances has lectured to undergraduates at the University of Technology, Sydney and the University of New South Wales, she has always made herself available to colleagues in need of assistance and advice and has

thrown herself enthusiastically into any work which would improve the conditions of librarians working on their own.

She won the Anne Harrison Award from the ALIA Health Libraries Section and gained international recognition when she was presented with the Cunningham Memorial International Fellowship from the Medical Library Association of America.

Her career and achievements inspire awe and a deep respect for what can be achieved by one very motivated and dedicated professional. She has truly deserved this year's award for outstanding contribution to special librarianship.
