# Sir John Morris memorial fund travelling scholarship

he Sir John Morris memorial fund travelling scholarship for 1996/97 was presented to Lloyd Sokvitne at a ceremony held in the State Library of Tasmania on 8 August.

Mrs Berta von Bibra, the chairperson of the State Library and Archives Trust which administers the scholarships, welcomed John Morris, AM, son of Sir John Morris for whom the award is named, and guests to the ceremony. Sir John Morris was the first chairman of the Tasmanian Library Board, and the fund which commemorates his name was established in 1957 to honour his work for libraries.

The travelling scholarships were first awarded in 1995 and are open to all residents of Tasmania who work in libraries or archives, or who are trained in these areas and are expected to develop the knowledge and skills of library and archive workers through travel to centres of excellence in library or archives fields.

Lloyd, who is the editor of *Tasmania Online* (http://www.tased.edu.au/tasonline/), applied for the scholarship to assist him to travel to libraries in the United States of America and

examine the services these libraries provide on the Internet. From his trip he expects to gain knowledge which will assist him to develop strategies for new and improved services based on *Tasmania Online*.

Lloyd believes very strongly that technological advances in digital resources and computer networks pose challenges to libraries, and that new services and approaches must be developed in order to maintain libraries' viability and relevance.

In recognition in the lack of interest and support of special librarians in Australia for the need for statistical information and analysis on Australian special libraries, it is recommended that the following motions form the Annual General Meeting in 1992 be rescinded.

Motion: That the National Special Libraries Section reaffirm their continuing com-

mitment to the Australian Specials Statistical Information Database (ASSID).

Motion: That carriage of responsibility for national management of the ASSID project be reviewed at each AGM and that it currently resides with the ACT group.

Motion: That National Special Libraries Section accepts responsibility for costs incurred in the production

and distribution of the ASSID questionnaires and worksheets to each Australian special library.

Motion: That National Special Libraries Section acknowledge the need for seeding funds and guarantee to bear anticipated costs in mind before committing national funds elsewhere.
