The impact of IT on library design

ver thirty participants attended the inaugural function of the ALIA Library Buildings and Equipment Special Interest Group at the State Library of New South Wales on Monday 9 September. Those attending heard the views of a panel of speakers from diverse backgrounds on the impacts of information technology on library planning and design.

Kerrie Millgate, manager of library services of the Australian Securities Commission, spoke from the perspective of a special library system within an organisation with highly sophisticated information technology provision. Here the potential to deliver direct to the desktops of Commission officers, and to take advantage of the space savings of legal and other materials in electronic form, is very marked. Steve O'Connor, university librarian of the University of Technology, Sydney, discussed the ways in which his library adapted to, and in many cases anticipated, the demands of new media and new client needs. He emphasised the continuing

need for adequate space for materials in traditional formats, and for adequate equipment and training space for staff and clients. Geoff Larkin, director of the architectural Stephenson and Turner International, presented an illustrated talk on the way information technology is accommodated in a number of French and Singaporean libraries which he has recently visited. Paul Scully, consultant with the State Library of New South Wales libraries branch, adverted to the opportunities which Internet access provides, particularly for public libraries, to make resources more widely available, to make themselves better known and to introduce information technology concepts to a wider public. He noted the success of Internet projects in creating local databases of community infor- information which was often already being collected for publica-

Dr David J Jones, convener of the special interest group, addressed the issues of defining space requirements when planning new

or assessing existing premises, and the need to combat the simplistic view that everything would be miniturised or available through the Internet, and that libraries would need less and less space.

He identified several factors tending to increase space demands, especially for public and academic libraries: the need for training space for users and staff; the additional space for PCs and printers, as well as writing space (frequently overlooked); increased demand generated by greater public awareness of library resources via the Internet; and the need for some libraries to cater for a variety of formats. He emphasised the need to create adaptable spaces which could cope with future technological and other changes.

In the lively discussion which ensued it was clear that there will be plenty of topics for the special interest group to pursue in the future, and suggestions for further topics and ways of communicating with other interested parties were invited.
