he Special Libraries Association and the FID/ET Clearinghouse Copenhagen have launched a project to donate copies of professional journals to colleagues in library and information science institutions in the less developed countries.

There are now over seventy library schools (mainly in China, Africa and Eastern Europe) who receive copies of Special Libraries Association and American Library Association journals. The concept of the project is based on the fact that in many work places several copies of these journals are received and that one or more of these duplicate copies could be sent as a donation to an institution to promote professional developments, help improve English language skills, and to keep librarians up to date with developments in the profes-

The FID/ET Clearinghouse is providing assistance by marketing the idea, collecting the data on donors and receivers, and matching them in a database. With reference to the very positive responses received and the great need for this kind of support, we would like to extend the scope of the project to the membership of ALIA where donations of inCite. Special Libraries News; Australian Library Journal and Orana would be most welcome. Next on the agenda is signing up more library schools in Africa and Latin America and raising awareness among the members of international professional organisations about this rewarding project.
