

Robert Williamson Award

or the first time, by special decision of the award committee, the annual Robert Williamson Award has been made to an organisation rather than to an individual. The award was made to Informit — the commercial arm of RMIT libraries, at the recent VALA (Victorian Association for Library Automation) conference in Melbourne.

The Williamson Award is one of Australia's highest honours for contributions to the information services industry. The award commemorates the work of the late Robert D Williamson, a pioneer in the field of online information services in Australia.

The citation recognised Informit's achievement in making extensive Australian information available on CD-ROM at a time when virtually none was available and the market was dominated by overseas information sources.

Beginning with AUSTROM in 1990, Informit currently publishes more than 20 electronic titles, in collaboration with more than 50 other organisations among which the National Library of Australia is preeminent. While remaining Australia's major CD-ROM publisher of bibliographic databases, Informit has diversified into multimedia publishing, and Internet publishing and training.

Recent titles, Australian feature films, and No place that's home are examples of Informit's commercially available multimedia titles. Many of the bibliographic titles are currently being

converted to SilverPlatter's SPIRS software: titles already converted include AUSTROM, Business Australia on disc and Serials in Australian libraries.

In his speech at the VALA dinner when the award was announced, Dr Schauder praised the joint effort of all the staff and associates who have contributed to Informit's work — in particular Tom Denison, Jan Swinburne, Jeff Leeuwenburg, Sandra Oxley, Soula Kipos and many others.
