he National Library of Australia is now inviting entries for the 1997 TDK Australian Audio Book Awards.

The Awards are administered by the National Library and sponsored by TDK (Australia). They are the only independent awards for audio books in Australia and are open to both commercial and non-commercial publishers.

Awards are offered for abridged and unabridged fiction and non-fiction. The judges also have a discretion to make a special award for an outstanding entry aimed at a younger market. The Trish Trinick Prize for the best narrator will be selected from among entrants for the Audio Book Awards.

Entries close on 2 June and are assessed by a panel of three judges. The judging

criteria encompasses the quality of narration, sound quality; quality of editing and preparation of text for audio; quality of packaging; and quality of announcements.
