Anne Harrison and the Award which commemorates her work

nne Harrison's life and work is commemorated in the Award which bears her name. The criteria for the Anne Harrison Award, which is administered by the ALIA Health Libraries Section, reflect the areas in which Anne Harrison made significant contributions to health librarianship in Australia. The Award provides financial assistance either for a research project addressing issues in health librarianship, or for a project which enriches the knowledge and skills of health sciences librarians, including assistance with publication costs of important works and with the costs associated with formal study or a study tour abroad.

The Award was first granted in 1987 to Linda Mulheron (Westmead Hospital) to support a research project on the quality and quantity of user education being offered in hospital libraries. In 1989 the recipient of the Award was Frances Bluhdorn (Royal Prince Alfred Hospital, Sydney) for research on measuring the impact of the hospital library on patient care. Unfortunately Frances was not able to undertake the research, and this topic continues as a significant issue in hospital libraries.

In 1991 Anne Batt (University of Western Australia Medical Library) received the Award to assist with the compilation and publication of a guide to resources to support the education and training of Aboriginal Health Workers. Another publication was supported in 1993 when the Award was granted to Veronica Delafosse to compile and publish a very useful bibliography, Resources for health sciences: a guide for Australia.

The current holder of the Award is Kathy Saurine (Community Health Services, Burnie). Kathy has undertaken a research project investigating the impact of the whole spectrum of privatisation on hospital and other health libraries. Kathy will be present her findings to the On the Edge conference in Perth.
