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9th National Library Technicians Conference, National Convention Centre, Canberra 24-26 September 1997

The conference committee has chosen the Hyatt Hotel Canberra as the venue for the conference dinner on Thursday 25 September. When opened in 1924 this hotel provided accommodation for Parliamentarians and visitors to the National Capital. The Hotel was constructed in the prairie style of architecture, using trademark natural materials, precise angular forms, continuous horizontals punctuated by short verticals and a sense that the building belonged to the landscape.

For the next fifty years the Hotel Canberra was used by Australian prime ministers, heads of state, ambassadors, diplomats, politicians, public servants, leading journalists, commentators and business men. In the mid-1970s the Hotel was closed for business and for some years housed Government offices, before being restored and luxuriously refurbished and extended in the style of the original Australian art deco architecture.

Dr Bob Pymm (manager of collection management at the National Film and Sound Archive in Canberra) is our keynote speaker for day three of our conference the theme of which is 'The technology'. Bob has worked as a part-time teacher on the library studies course at the Canberra Institute of Technology since 1985 when he started teaching 'Library

Automation'. He is currently delivering the unit for the last time this semester prior to the introduction of the Diploma of Library and Information Studies. Bob has also been involved with several other units relating to management and organisational behaviour. Before working at Canberra Institute of Technology he taught at Sydney Technical College the unit that was quaintly called 'Introduction to data processing' (aah... for the days of punched cards).

Bob has also taught at the University of Canberra on their undergraduate and graduate library programs. He is currently working with staff from the University of New South Wales and the National Film and Sound Archive in the development of an audio-visual archiving speciality to be offered remotely from the second half of next year.
