New chapter for regional library service

he people of Queanbeyan City and the surrounding region are now enjoying access to a first-class library facility after major extensions and upgrades costing close to half-a-million dollars were completed at the Queanbeyan City Library.

The library extensions and upgrades were officially opened on 13 March 1997 by the Hon Bob Debus, the Minister assisting the New South Wales Minister for the Arts.

The library extensions have added an additional 400 square metres of floor space allowing the previously separate adult and junior libraries to be combined into one integrated service. Queanbeyan City Council provided \$360 000 towards the upgrade and the State Library of New South Wales assisted with a \$100 000 capital development grant.

The major improvements to the library include a new study and research area; a newspaper and magazine reading area; display areas for community events and activities; CD-ROM and public access Internet

services; access for people with disabilities; and easier access to all collections.

The Mayor of Queanbeyan, Councillor Frank Pangallo, MBE made special mention of the library's extensive multicultural resources and services which are available to Queanbeyan's diverse cultural community, including books, magazines, newspapers and audio materials in a range of community languages. The library's free public access Internet service also enables library clients to access materials in languages other than English.

Public usage of the library services has increased dramatically in the past year with a twenty per cent increase in member registrations and an average of 12 000 clients using library facilities and services each month.

An exciting aspect of the additional library floor space is the potential it provides for greater involvement by the library in local community and cultural activities through displays, exhibitions, workshops, performances and launches.
