ArtsInfo where arts, culture and industry meet

ibraries around Australia will soon be in a better position to help cultural workers within their community.

On 13 August the Minister for Communications and the Arts, Senator Richard Alston, launches the new ArtsInfo service providing the first gateway to all possible avenues of support available to Australia's cultural sector.

Available through an Internet website and 1800 number, ArtsInfo will bring together more than 4500 cultural grants, training opportunities and industry development programs offered by Federal, State/Territory and local government, and by many corporations, foundations and non-government bodies.

ArtsInfo's website will also provide additional services designed to enhance the sector's business and marketing skills 'how to' modules and fact sheets; cultural statistics; links to other cultural websites; a list of training course providers; on-line tutorials; cultural industry publications, including the Smarts industry development magazine online; and a business showcase to promote Australia's export-ready cultural industries overseas.

For the Commonwealth Department of Communications and the Arts developing the service has been a major undertaking. The service covers a wide range of cultural areas - film, visual and performing arts, libraries, design and architecture, writing, publishing, museums, galleries, music, and heritage - and lists services offered by over 1200 service providers from a major flagship like the Australia Council to smaller providers like the many local shires.

People can use the website to search for grants, services and programs that suit their needs. For people coming through the telephone service, trained information officers all with strong cultural sector backgrounds can undertake searches for them, providing responses over the phone, or by fax or mail. Searches can be specific or as general as a person requires. People can also save searches to use again

ArtsInfo is an innovative new service which will make it much easier for people to find out what's available and where to go for information assistance in the cultural sector. It will provide better access for all cultural workers no matter where they live in Australia.
