Awards for outstanding technicians

wo national awards will be presented at the 9th National Library Technicians conference being held in Canberra from 24–26 September 1997. The awards are given in recognition of achievement by library technicians.

1997

Library Technician of the Year Kaye Bartlett will be named the 1997 Library Technician of the Year.

The Library Technician of the Year Award is sponsored by The Co-op Bookshop, providers of a full library and subscription service to all libraries. They have avail-

able local and overseas titles, best sellers, plus backlists from gen-



eral fiction to specialist texts including computer software, audio and cassette material.

The inaugural Library Technician of the Year Award was presented at the 5th National Library Technicians conference. The award aims to continue to promote the role and profile of library technicians in library and information services and the wider community, and to encourage technicians to join and support ALIA. It is open to any member of the Association's Library Technicians' section who holds a recognised technician qualification. Nominations may be made by members or divisions of the Association or employers. Nominations close on 1 June each year.

This year's recipient, Kaye Bartlett, has been a library technician since 1988, and has adopted a leadership role for library technicians in the Northern Territory. Kaye served two years as president of the Library Technicians section (Northern Territory), and was convenor of the very successful 8th National Library Technicians conference in 1995. Kaye represented library technicians during the development of the competency standards; wrote lecture notes for parts of the Acquisitions Module and taught students undertaking the Diploma in Library and Information Studies.

Kaye has also represented ALIA on the Course Advisory Committee — Diploma in Library and Information Studies, Northern Territory University. Kaye is currently an ALIA General Councillor — a representative for the ALIA Northern Territory branch. Kaye

is the first library technician to represent ALIA Northern Territory and the first library technician to be on the ALIA General Council. Kaye is known on a state, national and international level for her professionalism and attitude to the enhancement of ALIA and library technicians.

Kaye Bartlett is a very worthy recipient of the Australian Library and Information Association's Library Technician of the Year Award for 1997. Well done Kaye!

1997 Dunn & Wilson Scholarship

gong will be presented with the 1997 Dunn & Wilson Scholarship for her project:

'to examine job descriptions

within Australian libraries by focussing on library technician job descriptions. A great deal of time and resources are devoted to developing library job descriptions, but are they current, relevant and useful, both to the library technician and the relevant organisation?'

The Dunri & Wilson Scholarship is jointly sponsored by L.J. Cullen Bookbinders and Apollo Moon Bookbinders (Division of Dunn & Wilson) — specialist library bookbinders to public, special, legal and university libraries.

The firm of Dunn & Wilson was established in Scotland in 1909 as specialist library binders, and has been catering for libraries in Australia since 1976.

The first Dunn & Wilson Scholarship was presented at the 6th National Library Technicians Conference in 1981. This scholarship is linked to the national conference and is supported by the presentation of the Dunn & Wilson oration. The oration is presented by the previous recipient as part of the conference program.

We wish Lorraine well with her research and await the oration at the 1999 national Library Technicians conference.
