

The Public Libraries Section (national group) at their meeting at ALIA House in September

Online projects aim for Olympics and Federation

Promotion of the online services offered by public libraries to the community and the development of Olympic and Federation web sites by public libraries were some of the projects discussed at the September meeting of the Public Libraries Section (national group).

Representatives of the group met at ALIA House in Canberra on Friday 19 September 1997. Present were the chair, Val Moon (NSW), Craig Anderson (Vic), David Clarke (ACT), Duncan Furphy (WA), Kathie McNicol (Tas), Janice Nitschke (SA), Brenda Simpson (Qld), Kathy Stapleton (NT), Phyllis Paps, consultant, and ALIA executive director Virginia Walsh.

The Victorian branch will prepare a paper on their suggestions for web sites for the Olympic Games and the centenary of Australia's Federation, and Janice Nitschke will investigate individual library policies for online public access and report on the mechanisms and practicalities of this service.

Other issues included responses to the 2020 Vision statement, a strategic visions

paper to be prepared by Val Moon and the need to encourage increased membership of the Public Libraries Section.

Phyllis Papps, asked by the group to undertake a review of *Towards a quality service*, recommended the document be rewritten to reflect the wide variety of needs and organisational structures represented in state and territory public libraries.

The group has decided to investigate the development of 'Module 1', the compilation of a comprehensive annotated bibliography of relevant standards and legislation affecting library services in each State and Territory.

Virginia Walsh, executive director of ALIA, reported on the progress of discussions between ALIA and ACLIS, on the IFLA conference in Copenhagen, where she presented a *Lobby for libraries* seminar and on recent Government initiatives, including the *Online Public Access Initiative* and *Networking the Nation*.

The group will hold its next meeting at the PubRAISS conference held Brisbane in November.
