Winners announced

he VALA Award for 1996 has been won by the Royal Victorian Institute for the Blind for the development of a 'talking' catalogue which may be accessed at the Institute's Talking Book Library or through the Internet, and for the development of *Voiceprint*, a telephone-based information service.

The Voiceprint service provides improved access to the catalogue of the Talking Book Library. Library borrowers can phone in, search or browse the catalogue and order books using only the telephone keypad. Voiceprint users can also listen to the full-text of The Age, The Financial Review, and Business Review Weekly.

These two developments significantly improve the independence of people with print disabilities. They can interact directly with the library system, for both browsing and ordering of titles, in complete privacy and without the need for assistance from a sighted person.

The VALA Award is presented to the Australian library or information centre judged to have made the most innovative use of currently available computer technology to improve service to users. There was an unprecedented level of interest in both the VALA Award and the Travel scholarships awarded by VALA. The winners of the two travel scholarships were also announced — Andrew Treloar, from Deakin University, will investigate the role of libraries as facilitators in electronic publishing; and David Wells, from Curtin University of Technology, will travel to Japan to study the ways in which Japanese automated library systems treat multi-language, multi-script collections of material. Both winners will present papers on their research at the next VALA biennial conference.

Colourful enterprise

Provision of colour copying seems to be now accepted as de rigeur in libraries. The proliferation of print material in colour, often computer-generated, ensures that this demand will continue to grow. However, most colour photocopiers are much too complicated to allow the public access to this very expensive item without staff assistance.

Langley Park Manuafacturing have addressed this problem by introducing their new PACC-7 digital colour copier — launched at the ALIA conference in October. The machine combines the traditional ease of public use, whilst producing the highest colour copy quality and low copy costs. Overcoming the tyranny of distance

People throughout New South Wales can now read over 1000 journals from around the world via computer screens at their local public libraries.

This new service has been made possible by the installation of Electronic Reference Library (ERL) technology at the State Library of New South Wales.

The system, developed by SilverPlatter Information and distributed by GEAC Global Information, allows public libraries across New South Wales to access a number of subscription databases on the State Library's ERL server.

The move to adopt SilverPlatter's solution follows an increase in public demand for information, with attendance figures at public libraries across the state continuing to rise. The introduction of ERL means that library users have ac-

cess to the full-text of journal articles from over 1000 journal titles.

Library users across New South Wales can now search, retrieve and print of download the data in ASCI format via workstations in public libraries through and standard Web browser.
