

Business information in public libraries

The launch of eight business information collections in Victorian public libraries marks a new era of co-operation between local business communities and public libraries. It also coincides with the State Government's *Small Business May* promotions.

The business information collec-

tions, created in public libraries in Box Hill, Parkdale, Mornington, Caulfield, Frankston, Brighton, Coburg and Shepparton, are supported by specially trained staff and on-site electronic business information sources and document delivery systems.

The libraries' collections and serv-

ices will provide local business people with a range of information to meet their needs — including 'how to' handbooks, statistical data, directories, business news and company, industrial, legal and government information.

The project has been a co-ordinated effort by representatives of Victorian public libraries and the State Library of Victoria's Business Information Service. It is one of a number of Statewide projects funded by the State Government's library development grants through the State Library. Over the next year it is planned to extend the project to a further eight public libraries and expand links with other business information providers.

Kerrie Carstensen, manager of the State Library's business information service said she was delighted to be involved in the expansion of business information throughout Victoria. The local public library is the most accessible point for information for the majority of Victorians, she said.

The project was launched on 21 May by Victor Pertou, Member for Doncaster, at a function at Box Hill Library. ■

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


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
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
