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Innovation in education

ALIA has a historical role in the encouragement of innovation in library education. Setting educational standards and designing courses for the profession was one reason for the formation of the original association in 1937. The now well-established communication links between educators and the Association have enabled our profession to respond effectively to the demands of successive federal governments and employers for service benchmarks and competencies. Importantly, the Association's stimulus of educational innovation gives library educators and graduates from their institutions a career advantage in the developing information economy, as other professions, employers and governments recognise the importance of information literacy and management.

The annual course recognition returns from educational institutions to ALIA provide examples of innovative educational practice. Some of these are:

- development of an interactive multimedia learning package called 'What is information?' for students enrolled in the Bachelor of Applied Science in Information Studies at the University of Technology, Sydney. The package, based on an information literacy framework, includes profession practice applications, an electronic symposium, explanatory materials and an electronic notebook for students to record their learning;

- a program of continuing professional education known as the Summer Institute, including workshops and lectures from local and overseas scholars and practitioners on information literacy, the internet, information design and children's literature (University of Technology, Sydney);
- a three-week non-credit course for all undergraduates providing an introduction to the information systems and services of the University (Queensland University of Technology);
- development of an internet-based integrated learning environment with delivery of course units through the Internet (QUT);
- flexible delivery of courses at Newcastle, Gosford, Ultimo (Sydney) and Wollongong, combining distance learning and practice with monthly, full-day and face-to-face lectures and some on-site delivery (TAFE New South Wales);
- planning for distance education delivery in the Northern Territory (Northern Territory University);
- outreach programs where lecturers from a central institution go to smaller regional centres (North West Institute of TAFE, Burnie, Tasmania); and
- video-taped student presentations to aid assessment and help students to review their presentation and interview skills critically (Box Hill Institute of TAFE, Victoria).■

New era for access to Australian information

Informit Online launched

Co-operation between the National Library of Australia and RMIT Publishing is set to usher in a new era of service and convenience for people accessing Australian bibliographic databases.

In July, RMIT Publishing launched its new internet-based service — Informit Online — which will absorb the National Library's Ozline service and provide online access to the databases currently published by RMIT on CD-ROM.

Marketing research and customer feed-back has convinced RMIT Publishing and the National Library of Australia that a streamlined single service will best meet the needs of Australian users.

The new Informit Online service will offer users improved features including: web browser access; sophisticated search facilities; access to a wide range of Australian bibliographic and research databases; and flexible subscription options.

The Australian Public Affairs Index Service and the Australasian Medical Index are jointly-published by the Library and RMIT Publishing and will be available in the new RMIT service. The Interlibrary Resource Sharing Directory will continue to be available free-of-charge from the National Library of Australia's web server at <http://www.nla.gov.au/ilrs>.
