The British Council recently donated a wonderful collection of British publications — *Focus on Asia* — to North Sydney TAFE library. The collection consists of over 200 books on a variety of topics covering the Asian scene: commerce and economics, cultural studies, political and strategic studies, visual and performing arts, and literature.

A handing over ceremony was held at North Sydney TAFE library in June. Present were the director of the British Council in Australia, Jim Potts, and the exhibitions coordinator, Elizabeth Ramsay. During the ceremony the deputy director of North Sydney Institute of TAFE, Mr Sivakumar, paid tribute to the British Council for their generosity.

While the majority of the items in the *Focus on Asia* collection will remain at the North Sydney campus library, those titles already held by the library will be shared amongst the other Institute libraries. Through the TAFE Library Network these resources will also be available to other libraries throughout Australia via inter-library loan. ■

Encyclopaedia Britannica standard edition released

Encyclopaedia Britannica (Australia) Inc has released Britannica CD 98 Standard Edition. The single-disk, CD-ROM encyclopaedia operates on Macintosh, Windows 3.1x and Windows 95 platforms.

knowledge database, the Multimedia Edition's two-disk format offers additional applications. These include audiovisual capabilities and special tools such as Analyst, Spotlights and Timeline which enable users to navigate information and compare socioeconomic and historic information from countries and periods throughout history.

The Britannica Standard Edition includes an optional connection to Britannica Online, which is revised continuously. With Britannica Online users can find the most up-to-date information available from Britannica. Britannica Online also includes a variety of special features such as current-events information, classic articles by famous contributors from previous editions of the Encyclopaedia Britannica, special-topic databases, the biographies of notable people arranged by date of birth, and the brain-bending word game, Hapax Legomena.
