The future of interlending in public libraries

Recently the Metropolitan Public Libraries Association (NSW) in co-operation with the State Library of New South Wales held a highly successful one-day seminar at the ParkRoyal, Darling Harbour. This day showcased the latest developments occurring in document delivery and included presentations on NSW.net, Kinetica, JEDDS, LIDDA, the MPLA Interconnectivity Project and an update on the interlending scene in Australia from ACLIS. The seminar was sponsored by James Bennett, EBSCO, Altarama, Stowe, Databar, Fuji Xerox and LJ Cullens.

One of the days many highlights was the official launch of the MPLA *Document delivery guidelines* by the Minister for Local Government, The Honourable E Page. These guidelines were developed by the document delivery subcommittee, a working group of the MPLA. The members of this group were interlibrary loan officers and had the challenging task of looking specifically at document delivery with the aim of improving the service and co-operation between libraries.

The *Guidelines* address major issues facing the interlibrary lending service. These issues include improving delivery times, reviewing work practices, encouraging the more efficient use of technology and increasing user satisfaction. It is hoped that the *Guidelines* will become the standard by which all public libraries in Australia oper-

ate. Like the LIDDA project the *Guidelines* also wish to bring libraries together to form a kind of super-library that will cut a swathe through the mountain of paperwork currently required for most interlibrary lending.

The *Guidelines* encourage interlibrary loans to be dealt with at information counters immediately rather than dealing with them in a batch. Particular attention is drawn to Guideline 4 which states that a library will accept a request directly from another library's patron, without first referring that patron to their home library. This simple idea is indicative of the two themes that run through the guidelines (putting the customer first, not our own in-house procedures; and taking advantage of the new technologies). It is believed that such requests will become more common as catalogues are put on to the web.

The Guidelines will be promoted widely and are to be considered by the Country Public Libraries Association in late 1998. The Guidelines require a real change in our service culture and procedures. Current literature is full of the challenges we all have to face with the information super highway, and the need for libraries to adapt and stay relevant. The suggested procedures are a realistic response to the challenges facing us, and provide a very real opportunity for the library industry to change, yet remain the most important provider of information.
