### Northern Territory General Councillor

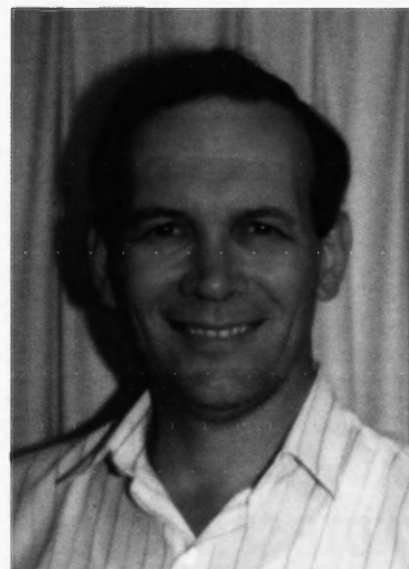
