ALIA/OPAI project takes off!

LIA has long advocated the participation of indigenous peoples at all levels of the library and information sector. Our most recent project, Indigenous Communities Online, is funded through the Online Public Access Initiative (OPAI), a Commonwealth initiative administered through the Department of Communication and the Arts. Indigenous Communities Online aims to provide online access for people in five participating communities, provide training and skills development in accessing online services, enhance the range of information available and the opportunities for enterprise, education and cultural development in these communities and develop and implement models for providing online access to other remote

Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander communities.

The project was piloted from 20 December 1997. Six participants spent four days receiving online training at the Manunda Library in Cairns. The participants, selected by their community, received comprehensive professional training in the use of a
