# Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander arts policy brochure available



# Queensland communities benefit from innovation funding

**Innovation grants for Queensland public libraries**

Residents around Burke will be able to borrow sporting equipment, and Broad-sound Shire Council will benefit by a mobile training laboratory which utilises internet and CD-ROM technology thanks to the Innovations Grants for Queensland Public Libraries, an initiative of the State Library of Queensland funded by the Queensland state government.

The grants encourage Queensland’s public librar-

ies to reach out to their communities and to deliver better, more imaginative services tailored specifically to their communities needs.

Applications for grants are judged by representatives from the Library Board, the Local Government Association of Queensland, the Chief Public Librarians’ Association, and the Country Lending Service, as well as the state librarian and the di-

rector of the State Libraries Public Libraries Division.

Sixty-seven entries were received. Nineteen were chosen to receive funding. All of the applications were well thought-out and several were joint projects which demonstrated a strong degree of co-operation in regional areas.
