## Institutional pilot of the ALIA Career development kit

ibrary and information professionals have long recognised the importance of Continuing Professional Development (CPD) in remaining flexible and adaptable to change in a dynamic sector.

Lifelong learning and workplace training are key components of CPD and they assist library and information sector professionals to manage the rapid changes in the workplace, and in the nature of professional practice.

ALIA recognises that employers have a crucial role to play in the provision of opportunities for staff to plan and undertake CPD. In assisting institutional members to successfully fulfil this role, the Association has been working to produce a career planning and recording tool.

The Career Development Kit was initially offered as a free service for personal members only, but following a decision of the ALIA Board of Education in November 1998, will now also be made available for institutional members.

The *Kit* is intended to be used by institutional members as a staff development tool by:

- enabling senior managers to gain an awareness of staff career development goals;
- identifying the training and skill-development needs of staff;
- assisting senior managers to contribute to the on-going job satisfaction of their staff; and
- providing a development benefit to staff.

A package of resources has been developed to support the *Kit* in a facilitated group environment and institutions have been approached to assist ALIA in determining how the *Kit* can be best used for this purpose.

The institutional pilot is currently under way, involving organisations from the public, schools, health, and university, college and research libraries sections of ALIA.

The first of these three-hour workshops was conducted at the Monaro Regional Library and Information Service, in Cooma on 12 April. Participants included Doris Ambrose, systems administrator; Robert Nelson, bookmobile operator; Anna Bremez, library assistant; and Kathy Stapleton, library manager.

The workshop gave the Association a valuable opportunity to see the resource in action in a facilitated group environment, as well as providing the library staff the opportunity to formally discuss important career development issues with their colleagues.

The *Kit* and workshop resources are available from ALIA National Office free of charge to institutional members.
