# Ruth McIntyre

## 1998 WA Special Librarian of the Year

uth McIntyre has been named as the WA Special Librarian of the Year for 1998. Ruth, the information resources manager of the Kondinin Group, has over twenty years of experience as a librarian. Ruth received her award at the ALIA WA Branch annual general meeting. Raeco International, particularly the Western Australian Manager, Roger Stanton, has supported this event since its inception.

Ruth McIntyre has worked in a wide spectrum of libraries and information centres throughout her career. In fact, she was the president of the New England Regional Group of the Library Association of Australia in 1976.

Her career has spanned thirty years, she has held positions at the University of Sydney, University of New England, CSIRO Pastoral Research Laboratory (Armidale, New South Wales) and the Western Australian Farmers Federation. In 1995, the Kondinin Group appointed Ruth to develop the information resources required to support the FarmLine Information Service, Later, this role was recognised as a business stream in its own right, in order to allow funds for provision of information to the organisation as a

As well as these roles, Ruth initiated and is the principal investigator of the fullyfunded project, Standardised classification scheme and thesaurus for Australian agricultural extension literature. Ruth is also the Kondinin Group's contact and co-ordinator for the Prime Notes project, a compilation of agricultural information on CD-ROM. Ruth co-ordinates the preparation of materials on behalf of the Kondinin Group and the Grains Research and Development Corporation. As well as these jobs, Ruth has made the time to supervise two practicum students.

Ruth worked as a committee member of the ALIA Special Libraries Section (WA Group) for two years. During this time, Ruth hosted two highly-informative tours to the Kondinin Group and presented a paper at the ALIA CPD Committee's Forum on Information Packaging. Presenting papers is Ruth's previously well-hidden talent. Between 1996 and 1998, she presented conference papers at the NSW Country Public Libraries' Association Conference, the 7th Asia Pacific Specials Law and Health Conference and the 5th ALIA Biennial Conference. If her abstract is accepted, Ruth will also speak at the 8th Asia Pacific Specials Law and Health Conference in Hobart later this year.

In July 1997, Ruth was elected as the Western Australian National Councillor for ACLIS and this led to her inclusion on Western Australian Branch Council. These committments necessitated her resignation from the Western Australian Special Libraries committee at the end of 1997.

In her role in the agricultural information sector, Ruth has been the president of the Agricultural Information Association for Australasia (AGRIAA) since October 1998.

Her employment history and active participation in and outside of ALIA show that Ruth is innovative, has initiative and is prepared to share her knowledge and expertise. With her tremendous experience and contribution to the information industry, Ruth is a worthy recipient of the 1998 Award.
