### University librarian: UTS

Alex Byrne has been appointed university librarian at the University of Technology, Sydney. Alex took up the position in March.

Alex was formerly pro-vice chancellor (information resources) at the Northern Territory University. He brings diverse experiences of librarianship to UTS and believes that issues for librarians extend from international human rights to the individual's equitable and flexible access to information.

Alex sees important challenges for university libraries. Providing more flexible services while maintaining quality and responsiveness to student diversity is a central issue. 'We have to go out to where people are; our services have to be ubiquitous. Our clients are saying "I want to do it in my time, at my place, in my way." We must move away from the notion that the library is a secular temple in which people come to worship information. We have to reach out to our clients — across the road or across the world. And we have to know a lot more about them.'

'Now that the average working life contains six to eight major employment changes, we must help students develop lifelong learning capacities,' Alex says. 'When librarians and academics develop information skills programs in partnership, their students learn skills for lifelong professional development as well as the skills and understanding required currently.'
