Awards for outstanding ALIA members

ALIA Manager of the Year and Library Technician of the Year

ach year ALIA awards members for outstanding service to the profession: the ALIA Manager of the Year and the ALIA Library Technician of the Year are open to personal members of the Association.

The ALIA Manager of the Year Award recognises and encourages good management practices within Australian libraries and information services.

The ALIA Library Technician of the Year Award aims to: promote the role of library technicians in library and information services; promote the role and image of library technicians in the library and information workforce and the wider community; and encourage library technicians to join and support the Association.

ALIA Manager of the Year

The ALIA Manager of the Year is awarded for excellence in library management. Librarians are nominated by their superiors and subordinates, with supporting evidence. Last year the standard of nominations was exceptionally high and two winners were announced: Susan McKnight, university librarian of Deakin University, Geelong, Victoria, and Janine Schmidt, university librarian at the University of Queensland. Both librarians had set clear visions, planned and consulted extensively and had transformed and positioned their libraries for the future.

Eligibility

Any personal member of the Australian Library and Information Association responsible for the management of a library service, an individual library or information service, or a significant service or project within a larger organisational unit, is eligible for the Award. As managers, nominees should have demonstrated outstanding skills in planning, resource allocation, project management, communication, leadership, interpersonal relations and marketing.

Selection criteria include:

· demonstrated leadership;

- demonstrated excellence in management skills;
- successful communication and relations between the service and its clientele; and
- significant improvement in service delivery as a result of the nominee's innovative management practices.

ALIA Library Technician of the Year

Helen Pickers, a Queenslander working in a mining information centre, won the 1999 award of ALIA Library Technician of the Year. Helen's work includes collection maintenance, reference work, staff training and monitoring electronic information systems which require Y2K compliance. She also made significant contributions to the library profession for the past ninteen years, giving conference papers, organising promotional events and participating in the setting of professional competency standards.

Selection

The Award is administered by a subcommittee. The selection criteria include:

- the nominee has made an outstanding contribution to the advancement of library technicians;
- the publication of a paper or papers relating to library technicians' work for presentation at a conference or for publication in a journal or monograph of library science; and
- personal achievement in the development of library and information services or for development within the Australian Library and Information Association.

Confidentiality

It is essential that nominations remain confidential and the nominee is unaware of their nomination.
