elebrating academic achievement in librarianship, Insight Informatics has awarded Margo Till with the prestigious Libero Prize for excellence. Margo achieved a grade point average of 6.75 out of a possible 7 while completing a Master of Information Technology at the Queensland University of Technology.

Currently employed as liaison librarian at the University of Queensland Library, Margo expressed her surprise and delight at receiving the award. She also commended Insight Informatics for supporting new graduates in the information profession.

Margo said that she was first attracted to the field of librarianship while studying for her Master of Arts at the University of Queensland. She said that she saw the library as a place of change and growth and felt that a career in librarianship would offer her a wide range of opportunities in a number of areas, including teaching, technology and research.

Tour of three special libraries in Adelaide

successful walking tour of three specialised libraries on 14 June was attended by more than thirty library workers. The three libraries were the Australian Bureau of Statistics (ABS) Library, the History Trust Library and the Housing, Environment and Planning Library. All three libraries are located within the city of Adelaide.

The tour started from the Foyer of the Commonwealth Centre. Our first host was Pam Balfour, the librarian from the ABS library. The ABS library's catalogue has more than 40 000 titles, with access to numerous CD-ROMs and databases. The library also provides internet training for ABS staff. The library is involved in a library extension program. This program essentially involves placing in libraries a core collection of ABS publications which can be accessed by the community at large — thus extending access to and availability of statistical data.

The second part of the tour stopped at the History Trust in Edmund Wright House. This building is probably more known to the people of Adelaide, as the 'old' Birth, Deaths and Marriages building. Lynn Drew, the History Trust librarian, then led groups of librarians up flights of wooden stairs to the History Trust's library. The library services History Trust staff and interested history practitioners.

Of special interest is the Glass Negative Photographic Collection. Within the collection are recorded ceremonial events, the dayto-day progress of major public works, the growth of ports, industry, trade, townships, people at work and people at play: in short, everything that interests governments. After viewing the library, we climbed down the stairs to a well earned cup of tea and biscuits!

The last stop of the tour was the Housing, Environment and Planning Library in Roma Mitchell House. Library manager Wendy Bromell explained the function of the library, its contents and staffing arrangements. The library has a generous collection of books, and journals, plus a workroom for library staff.
